KIDS and CANCER BENEFIT HONORED WITH COMMUNITY CARE AWARD

The CARE for Children Board of Directors honored the Kids and Cancer Benefit with the organization's Community CARE Award at the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors on December 6, 2023.

"Tonight's award celebrates the Kids and Cancer Benefit and the many volunteers who make that organization so successful and such a driving force for good in our community," noted Mick Marshall, CARE board member. "We at CARE for Children have witnessed this generosity first-hand through their support of children in our program who have complex and costly medical needs that require extensive travel for medical treatment by providing gas cards for families. All of us at CARE are grateful for the work they do."

The Community CARE Awards were established by the Board of Directors in 2003 to recognize outstanding contributions to the agency and to the children and families to whom CARE provides services.

The annual meeting also focused on the 2022-2023 fiscal year, the 10th Anniversary of the Ashley Booth Griffin CARE for Children Center, and recognition of staff members who had reached milestone years of service.

Tyler R. Hannah, CARE board president, provided a review of the fiscal year which had an overall theme of 'Growing with CARE.' He highlighted the organization's impact during the year, the growth of CARE programs and services, and in conclusion, he thanked his fellow board members, CARE staff members, volunteers, donors, and the community for "helping to make CARE what it is today and for investing in its growth for an outstanding tomorrow."

Greg Booth, chair of CARE's long-range planning committee, gave a special presentation on the progress and positive impact of the organization since the new center opened its doors in 2013. On a personal note, Booth remarked "My wife Cherie and I are pleased that the Ashley Booth Griffin CARE for Children Center provides an enduring legacy for children of all abilities in memory of our beloved daughter Ashley, and it also helps CARE grow in services provided, children positively impacted, and the organization's stature as one of our community's outstanding non-profit organizations."

CELEBRATING PEDESTRIAN SAFETY MONTH

October is Pedestrian Safety Month, and according to Safe Kids Worldwide, children are on average twice as likely to be hit by a car and killed on Halloween than on any other day. Unintentional pedestrian injuries are the fifth leading cause of injury-related death in the United States for children ages 5 to 19.

Marshall and Hannah also reinforced Halloween safety tips with the preschool students, including carrying glow sticks or

flashlights; using reflective tape or stickers on costumes or bags; wearing light colors; walking on sidewalks or paths; and safely looking both ways before crossing a street.

Each preschool student, as well as students at the nearby Bradford Headstart location, received a Halloween safety tip sheet, a glow stick, and a copy of the book to take home and share with their families. CARE received the donation of <u>Clifford Takes a Walk</u> books from the Highway Safety Network.

HELP FOR CARE FAMILIES

Since July, CARE has fulfilled 72 special assistance requests positively impacting 74 active clients, 115 siblings, and 88 adults (includes some recurring families).

The program is supported by the Rotary Special Assistance Fund and helps CARE provide "little extras," help in emergency situations, and complete special projects for local children who receive therapy services from the organization or who have special health care needs. In the past, the fund has helped families with ramps, gas cards and hotel stays for medical visits/ hospital stays, medical supplies not covered by insurance, emergency food and clothing, holiday meals and gifts, and funeral expenses.

The Rotary Special Assistance Fund was established by the Rotary Club of Bradford. It is funded with a portion of each Rotarian's annual dues, private donations, grants, and an allocation from CARE's endowment fund. The fund is part of CARE's Community Outreach/ Family Support Services.
