Cribs for Kids® Receives Grant Funding

The Dr. Lyle F. Renodin Foundation, a Ministry of the Franciscan Sisters of Allegany, New York, donated \$1,860 to CARE for Children to purchase Cribs for Kids[®] Safe Sleep Survival Kits for local families in need.

Developed by Cribs for Kids[®] National Infant Safe Sleep Initiative, the program provides safe sleep environments for families in need and provides a consistent safe sleep message to the community. The goal is to reduce the number of accidental infant sleep-related deaths.

"Infant Safe Sleep Awareness is an on-going effort and as our organization works to provide education that the safest way for a baby to sleep is alone on his or her back in a safety-approved crib, it is essential that we have cribs to distribute to those in need," said Tina Martin, Executive Director. "We are grateful for the funding provided by the Renodin Foundation to purchase twenty Safe Sleep Survival Kits, which include a Cribs for Kids[®] Cribette[®], SleepSack, sheet, pacifier, and educational materials, for distribution in the communities we serve in McKean County."

CARE for Children provides child safety and injury prevention initiatives through its leadership of the Safe Kids Pennsylvania— McKean County Partnership. The partnership aims to promote the prevention of accidental child injuries through education, collaboration and advocacy.

The Renodin Foundation provides grants for programs and projects serving people in the Allegany/ Cattaraugus Counties of New York and McKean County, Pennsylvania whose public charitable purposes are carried out in a manner consistent with the tradition of the Franciscan Sisters.

Grant awards show a connection to the mission of the Foundation and assist the needy, underprivileged, elderly, developmentally disabled, handicapped, or economically disadvantaged.

Cribs for Kids® Program Active During Pandemic

Do You Know a Baby In Need of a Crib?

During the ongoing coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the McKean County Cribs for Kids[®] Program is still operating.

CARE's safe sleep educators conduct the infant safe sleep education for parents over the phone or via video conferencing. After the education component is complete, arrangements are made to deliver the crib and safety items to the family while practicing safe social distancing practices.

According to the National Cribs for Kids[®] Program, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) is the leading cause of death in infants age one month to one year, and in the United States over 3,500 babies will die unexpectedly each year.

Research indicates that many and perhaps most of these deaths are related to an unsafe sleeping environment. Researchers do not know what causes SIDS, but have identified modifiable risk factors. Education focuses on A-B-C: <u>Alone</u> in the Crib, babies should be placed on their <u>Backs</u> and should sleep in a <u>Crib</u> even when napping. The Cribs for Kids[®] Program has two important strategies to reduce these deaths which are making sure an infant has a safe place to sleep and providing education to families.

Families in need of a crib for an infant can call CARE at **814-362-4621.** Health care providers, athome visitors, Children and Youth Services, and early childhood programs are also encouraged to make referrals to the program.

Preschool Hosts Online STEM Programs

Rainbow Corner Preschool teachers offered a six week STEM Enrichment Program this fall in addition to what is regularly incorporated into the early learning curriculum. The programs focused on Science, Technology, Engineering and/or Mathematics.

For the past several years, the STEM program extended the school day once a week for the fouryear-olds in the program. With the constraints of the pandemic, the teachers decided to offer it on Tuesday afternoons via Zoom, and invited all students to participate. The live sessions were recorded and shared with families who were unable to attend the live program.

A bag of supplies was sent home prior to the first session. Students and their parents made bird feeders and homemade bubbles, built cup towers and Play-Doh shapes, learned about color mixing, centered around the book <u>A Little Blue and A Little Yellow</u>, and did an experiment with sinking and floating.

Early learning programs at CARE are funded, in part, with funds from the United Way of the Bradford Area, Inc.

CARE Awarded Grants for PPE

CARE for Children has expended considerable resources on materials and supplies to mitigate the effects of COVID-19 and keep employees and program participants safe. To assist these efforts, CARE was the recipient of two grants this fall from the McKean County Community Foundation and the United Way of the Bradford Area, Inc. The grants have helped CARE offset the cost of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) and other items needed to support operations through the pandemic.

With the funds, CARE was able to purchase and have installed a stackable washer/dryer for use by the preschool and other programs, purchase PPE, like cloth masks, disposable masks, and face shields for program participants and staff, as well as thermometers, hand sanitizer, and cleaning supplies.

Additional supplies were purchased for the preschool program to assist with social distancing and to maintain necessary health and cleaning protocols.

The grant funding enables CARE to use operational dollars directly on program expenses rather than items necessary to prevent/mitigate the effects of COVID-19. Funding to offset these costs makes it easier for CARE to deliver its mission of 'improving the lives of children of all abilities'.

Annual Meeting Held in December

The CARE for Children Board of Directors held its annual meeting on December 3rd, 2020.

The meeting was held via Zoom and attended by board members and staff.

Board President, Norm Strotman, gave a summary of the 2019-2020 fiscal year including organizational statistics.

Finance & Office Manager, Valorie Coast, provided a review of CARE's financial status during Fiscal Year 2019-2020, by reviewing the *Revenue and Expenditure Graphs* reported out in the Annual Report as well as providing a picture of CARE's fiscal operations during the pandemic.

Executive Director, Tina Martin, gave staff and program updates; recognized board and staff for their efforts during the pandemic; and presented a video with highlights from 2019-2020.

Several staff members presented:

Social Worker, Joy Haney, MSW, LSW, discussed Infant Mental Health.

Physical Therapist, Dana Pence, PT, presented on the challenges and triumphs of adopting tele-intervention during the pandemic. She cited the high level of teamwork which has made the therapy staff successful during these difficult times.

Pediatric Therapy Services Director, Ashley Carlson, MOT, OTR/L, explained the Early Intervention Coaching Model adopted by CARE seven years ago and how it has been successfully and actively used for tele-intervention sessions.

Development and Marketing Coordinator, Leslie Kallenborn, presented a synopsis of 2019-2020 fundraising and development efforts.

Therapeutic Recreation Programs Offered Virtually

Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, CARE decided to offer four different virtual programs in place of our traditional in-person therapeutic recreation programs.

In September CARE provided materials for each participating student to create and plant their own mini garden with the help of Finance and Office Manager, Valorie Coast and Physical Therapist, Ann Kane, PT. During this 30-minute virtual session, students were not only instructed on how to assemble their mini garden but how to care for it as well. Each student was provided with gloves, potting soil, a garden container, plants and garden accessories.

The next event was held just in time for Halloween. Students were provided with a white painted pumpkin, spooky stickers and paint; and were encouraged to be creative in decorating their pumpkins. This event was led by Speech Therapist, Kylie Battin, M.S., CCC-SLP; Occupational Therapy Assistant and Special Instructor, Melanie Buchanan, BS, COTA/L; and Preschool Director and Special Instructor, Kimberly Engstrom, M.Ed.

In November the "No Cook Cooking Night" had students gaining skills measuring, pouring and creating delicious treats with no actual cooking involved. Each student received a set of measuring cups and spoons, a package of Oreos, chocolate frosting, candy eyes, and Kit-Kat bars to assemble penquin cookies and also other assorted food items to make their own trail mix. This event was led by Occupational Therapist, Kim Miller, OTR/L and Physical Therapist, Dana Pence, PT.

"Build-a-Friend" was held in December and each child was given all the supplies to build their very own bear. Each student was provided with a bear, stuffing, an outfit, a mask and fabric markers to assemble, dress and name their new friend. Physical Therapist, Lauren Warmath, DPT and Speech Therapist, Gina Kane, M.S., CCC-SLP instructed this event via Zoom.

"Each of these programs focused on fine motor skills, creativity and socialization and an added bonus was the incredible level of parent engagement," said Tina Martin, executive director. "CARE is grateful for the anonymous sponsor who made the purchase of all the supplies and materials possible as well as the United Way for the annual allocation to therapeutic recreation which underwrites the planning, preparation and staffing of these programs."

The National Association of Letter Carriers Branch #293 recently dissolved the Thomas M. "Tommy" Frontino Memorial Fund and contributed the balance of \$4,793.40 to CARE for Children.

The donation was designated to support CARE's therapeutic recreation program, which aligns with the original intent of the fund, to help local children access recreational opportunities. The contribution will be placed in CARE's endowment fund, which provides funding each year for free therapeutic recreation programs for local children.

Recreation programs are staffed by CARE therapists and serve as an extension of traditional school-based therapy allowing children to practice skills and have fun in a community-based, inclusive environment.
