RAINBOW CORNER PRESCHOOL OPENS IN THE ASHLEY BOOTH GRIFFIN CARE FOR CHILDREN CENTER

Almost 4 months to the day that CARE for Children opened the doors to its new facility on East Main Street, the staff welcomed preschool students and toddlers into the new classrooms on Tuesday, September 4th. The squeals of delight, the happy laughter, and the other voices of little people were welcome sounds to the staff.

"The new preschool classroom was designed to be fun and efficient for our students and staff," said Tina Martin, CARE executive director. "There is a reading loft, kid size sinks and art center, and a great area for circle time."

The Creative Play Room (second classroom) is being used for CARE's Toddler Developmental Playgroup which promotes language development; and the development of social skills for children 24 months to 42 months.

The playgroup has two sessions and there is waiting list.

A Smart Board was recently installed in the preschool for the

teachers and students to use. The Smart Board was purchased by the Bradford Area School District as part of the Keystones to Opportunity Grant to support District-wide literacy efforts from birth through school age. The grant also supplied a literacy curriculum which

Preschool Director, Kimberly Engstrom, M.Ed. is adopting for the preschool this year. "The preschool staff is thrilled with the opportunities the new building is providing for our program," said Engstrom.

"We will be adding technology, which prepares students for Kindergarten. The

Registration remains open for an Early Learning Playgroup in Port Allegany for children 3-5 years of age.

"CARE is exploring the possibility of opening a three day a week, licensed preschool program in Port Allegany," said Kimberly Engstrom, preschool director.

The playgroup meets on Thursdays from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm at the Gethsemane Lutheran Church Social Hall and began on September 5th with eight students enrolled. The playgroup will accept students throughout the school year if space is available.

The playgroup promotes socialization, Kindergarten readiness skills, and structured play. Activities are based on the Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards for preschool students.

The Early Learning Playgroup is staffed by Alexis Close, M.Ed., who holds a masters degree in Early Learning, and teacher's aide, Vivian Lamont.

CARE for Children passes rigorous ethics and accountability standards to be recertified

CARE for Children has again been awarded the Pennsylvania Association of Nonprofit Organizations (PANO) Seal of Excellence for successfully completing the Standards for Excellence® re-certification program. CARE voluntarily opened itself up to scrutiny by a "jury of its peers" who examined for compliance with PANO's Standards for Excellence: An Ethics and Accountability Code for the Nonprofit Sector®.

CARE for Children's programs and services, management, fundraising, and financial practices were re-examined in depth before the certification was awarded. CARE for Children was one of the first organizations to be certified under the Standards program that began in 2002 in Pennsylvania.

Martin, executive director. "CARE for Children's work on behalf of children of all abilities exemplifies both our dedication to our mission and to meeting the highest standards of ethical practice."
