From the President



During the 2019-2020 fiscal year, COVID-19 challenged the CARE staff to innovate, to adapt, and to transition to providing therapy services through tele-medicine. For the first time in almost 50 years Rainbow Corner Preschool ended the school year early, in March. After that the teachers and staff met preschool students weekly over Zoom. Like so many of us, the staff transitioned to making the best of working at home and ensuring that many

services could be offered in some form.

The pandemic has renewed the board of directors' focus on organizational stability and sustainability. In the past 10 years CARE ran a successful capital campaign and constructed the Ashley Booth Griffin CARE for Children Center, and upon completion of the capital campaign launched a successful annual fund. New staff have been hired, programs have been created and expanded to meet the needs of local children, and the center has been an asset to the growth and aspirations of CARE.

As we look towards the future--- new goals need to include, an investment in technology and training; the retention and recruitment of outstanding staff; and increasing inclusion and outreach services. The board is also working to build donor awareness and support of our endowment to not only provide a safety net, insuring needs are met, but to fuel growth.

Fiscal Year 2019-2020 was a year of challenges, not only for CARE for Children but for so many of our businesses, non-profits and for so many of us. It also saw generosity and kindness. In whatever way you supported CARE for Children and the greater community, thank you. What CARE for Children does right...


The CARE staff has long excelled at establishing rapport with families, using parent coaching to empower families, and adapting approaches to engage families while remaining cognizant of the barriers that families face.

CARE *Social Work* services help families access resources and get help in times of crisis or change. *Family Support* programs boost parent self-advocacy skills as well as promote networking with other families to strengthen natural supports. CARE also has a well-established *Special Assistance Fund*, where the staff, on behalf of families, may request items or other supports.

What can CARE do better?

At CARE, we need to continue to train staff to identify barriers that may prevent a child from thriving. CARE needs to constantly improve program quality and work to identify under-served children. Ongoing, dynamic collaboration with other organizations is needed to provide a comprehensive range of services for families and children. Identifying needs is not enough—we must continue to strive to meet our families where they stand.

The last half of this fiscal year has been challenging but also grace-filled. Donors stepping forward in even greater numbers, and widespread community support not just for CARE for Children but for so many organizations that seek to do good. Pediatric Therapy Services

School-Based Therapy Services

CARE works with school districts across McKean County, the Coudersport School District in Potter County, and with home-schooled students to ensure students with disabilities and delays receive physical and occupational therapy services. These services help children better access the school curriculum.

School-based therapy services focus on children with Individual Education Plans (IEP's) or 504 plans who are identified by the district as needing additional services.

Physical therapy centers on a child's basic movement, balance and coordination, helping students navigate the classroom, physical education class, the playground and other school environments and activities.

Occupational therapy focuses on the development of a child's fine motor skills. The occupational therapy staff works to help children accomplish the daily tasks required for success in school, such as writing, painting, playing with toys, and cutting with scissors.

Therapists also work with adaptive equipment and make adaptations to the school environment.

School-based therapists work closely with the school team and students' families to deliver responsive services and to help each student treated reach his or her potential.

Early Intervention, Birth to Three

Physical Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech-Language Pathologists, and Special Instructors provide treatment for infants and toddlers who have been identified with developmental delays. Therapy is provided in the child's natural environment using a coaching model to encourage parent/caregiver participation in treatment.

CARE also has a Social Worker on staff who may assist families by providing emotional support, identifying and coordinating community resources, and/or offering parent education, counseling and crisis intervention.

Early Intervention is a collaboration of services which assist and empower families in improving their young child's development. Referrals are made by pediatricians, other health care providers or parents/caregivers to the county Early Intervention system who then refer the child for evaluation and treatment.

Early Learning Programs

Rainbow Corner Preschool

Rainbow Corner Preschool is an inclusive program serving children three to five years of age. The preschool is licensed by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and follows a curriculum that is aligned with Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards.

Rainbow Corner fosters an environment to meet each student's developmental and early learning needs. The learning centers in each classroom are equipped with appropriate materials to enhance and support the curriculum.

CARE also has developmentalists on staff to help address specific developmental delays.

The preschool's inclusive setting is designed to enhance each child's physical, social, emotional and cognitive development. Rainbow Corner encourages students to be active explorers of the world.

Developmental Playgroup

CARE's Developmental Playgroup focuses on the unique developmental needs of toddlers ages 24-42 months. Focusing on language development, the playgroup helps children enhance and acquire language skills by providing a language rich environment.

Social and sensory skills are promoted through structured play while focusing on manners and self help skills. Playgroup focuses on activities that encompass one or more of the five senses and how toddlers can better explore the environment around them.

Summer Early Learning

CARE hosts summer day camp for preschool age students which focus on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Mathematics) activities. The camp was cancelled in summer of 2020 due to the pandemic.

Developmental Screenings

CARE therapists and early learning staff held a Developmental Screening Day at the Ashley Booth Griffin CARE for Children Center in October of 2019.

Throughout the year, CARE therapy and early learning staff also conduct developmental, gross motor, and scoliosis screenings in early learning programs, and at schools, health fairs, and other community events.

Community Outreach

Community Outreach: Family Support and Engagement

Community outreach efforts are important initiatives in CARE's overall delivery of services and programs. By recognizing the toll raising a child with special health care needs may take on a family, CARE aims to provide positive supports.

Many of CARE's programs focus on family engagement to ensure better outcomes for the children who participate. We want families to join in decision-making and goal setting for their child; engage families in two-way communication and advocacy; and to provide coaching and learning activities for the home and in the community.

Efforts include family coaching in the Early Intervention Program; providing information, referrals and connections to community resources; programs like Best Baby Playgroups which aim to help parents enhance their young child's development; participation in community events like Kids Fest; and the sponsorship of parent education, family support and professional workshops on a variety of topics.

Disability Awareness

CARE's Disability Awareness program aims to promote acceptance for children with physical and developmental disabilities. CARE conducts presentations upon request for schools in McKean and Potter Counties, as well as presentations for civic and professional groups.

Equipment Loan

CARE loans walkers, wheelchairs, lifts, bath chairs, adaptive recreation equipment, and other items with the referral of a health care provider. Equipment is subject to fit and availability.

Verner W. Smith Adaptive Equipment Clinic

CARE provides consultative services in collaboration with mobility professionals to provide a team approach for filling prescriptions for medical and adaptive equipment; and making necessary adjustments and repairs.

Therapeutic Recreation

Adaptive Camps, Clinics and Recreation Activities

Therapeutic recreation for children with disabilities provides many benefits including; cardiovascular fitness and improved strength, balance, coordination and muscle control. It also improves self-esteem, provides an opportunity to gain socialization skills and encourages fair-play and sportsmanship.

CARE's recreation programs for 2019-2020 included: The Trailblazers Basketball and Soccer Teams; Byllye Lanes Bowling with the Exchange Club; the Holiday Movie Celebration at the Main Street Movie House; Port Allegany Rotary Holiday Party; the Holiday Valley Adaptive Ski Clinic; and the Basketball Mini-Camp at the YMCA.

CARE Kid Fitness

CARE therapists assist the physical education teachers from George G. Blaisdell Elementary and School Street Elementary who conduct weekly adaptive gym classes to promote life-long fitness and the positive self-esteem of students receiving therapy services.

Child Passenger Safety Week

CARE for Children is the lead agency for the Safe Kids McKean County Partnership with Safe Kids Pennsylvania. Safe Kids McKean is guided by an advisory committee comprised of representatives from local and state organizations, and volunteers; and child safety and injury prevention programs and initiatives are supported by United Way funding, donations, sponsorships, grants and CARE for Children Trust Income.

MCKEAN COUNTY CRIBS FOR KIDS

McKean County Cribs for Kids, a National Infant Safe-Sleep Initiative, promotes infant safe sleep practices for local families. The program provides a Cribette portable crib or Pack 'n Play® if families cannot otherwise afford safe-sleeping environments for their infants. CARE has two Safe Sleep Trainers on staff who provide education and training on proper sleep position and sleep environment for the baby.

CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY (CPS)

Safe Kids works closely with volunteer Tawnya Slater, Certified CPS Technician, other local, volunteer CPS Techs, the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics Traffic Injury Prevention Project (TIIPP) and the Bradford Regional Medical Center to properly fit car seats and provide replacement seats if needed. The program requires that a certified car seat technician fit and properly install the seat in the vehicle, and the car seat needs to be the primary seat for the child. During the fiscal year, a total of 17 car seats were replaced and installed; and an additional 21 car seats were checked for proper fit and installation.

HOME SAFETY ITEM REFERRAL & PARENT RESOURCES

Since 2012, the McKean County Partnership has worked with at-home visitors to bring necessary home safety items / childproofing items to families in need. Safe Kids distributes various items such as door knob covers, cupboard locks and latches, outlet covers, appliance locks, toilet seat locks, furniture straps, smoke detectors, and carbon monoxide detectors. The McKean County Family Centers, Parents as Teachers program, and Early Intervention providers are active partners for this program, providing family referrals.

RIDE SAFE BICYCLE SAFETY EVENTS

Safe Kids Pennsylvania - McKean County Partner has an ongoing effort which supports bicycle safety and helmet use initiatives for school age children. CARE staff, along with the support of the United Way (Bradford, Smethport and Port Allegany Campaigns), participates in bicycle safety education, helmet give-aways and fittings for local Kindergarten classes and by request.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Throughout the year, representatives from the Safe Kids Partnership, CARE staff and child safety partners participate in various community-wide initiatives and events to promote child safety and injury prevention efforts. The partnership also provides training on various child safety-related topics to organizations and community groups.

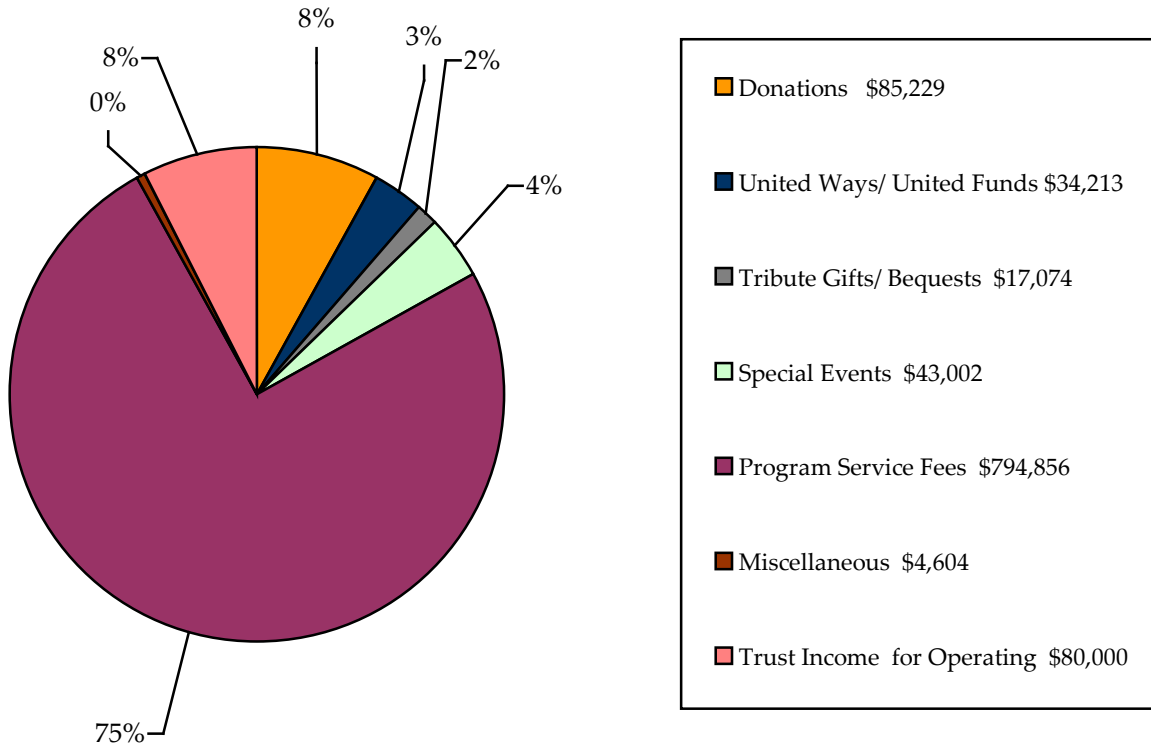

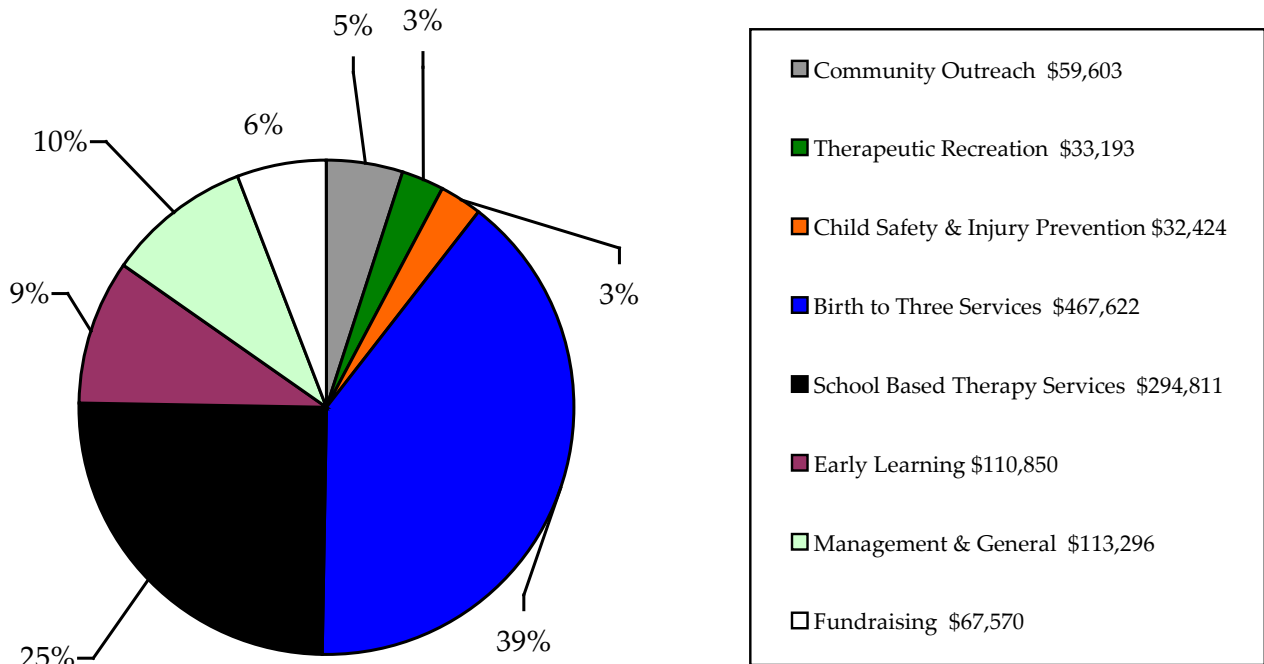
