Tediatric Therapy Services

School-Based Therapy Services

CARE works with school districts across McKean County, the Coudersport School District in Potter County, and with homeschooled students to ensure students with disabilities and delays receive physical and occupational therapy and Speech-Language Services. Therapy helps children better access the school curriculum.

School-based therapy services focus on children with Individual Education Plans (IEP's) or 504 plans who are identified by the individual school districts as needing additional services. School-based therapists work closely with the school team and students' families to deliver responsive services and to help each student treated reach his or her potential.

Physical therapy centers on a child's basic movement, balance and coordination, helping students navigate the classroom, physical education class, the playground and other school environments and activities.

Occupational therapy focuses on the development of a child's fine motor skills. The occupational therapy staff works to help children accomplish the daily tasks required for success in school, such as writing, painting, playing with toys, and cutting with scissors.

Speech-language pathologists (SLP) assess, diagnose, treat and help to prevent disorders related to speech, language, communication, voice, and fluency. The goal of school-based SLPs is to remediate, improve or alleviate student communication within the educational environment.

Therapists also work with adaptive equipment and make adaptations to the school environment.


Early Intervention, Birth to Three

Physical Therapists, Occupational Therapists, Speech-Language Pathologists, and Special Instructors provide treatment for infants and toddlers who have been identified with developmental delays. Therapy is provided in the child's natural environment using a coaching model to encourage parent/caregiver participation in treatment.

CARE also has a Social Worker on staff who assists families by providing emotional support, identifying and coordinating community resources, and/or offering parent education, counseling and crisis intervention.

Early Intervention is a collaboration of services which empower families in improving their young child's development. Referrals are made by pediatricians, other health care providers or parents/caregivers to the county Early Intervention system who then refer the child for evaluation and treatment.

Early Learning

Rainbow Corner Preschool

CARE for Children's Rainbow Corner Preschool provides outstanding early learning experiences for children three to five years of age.

Rainbow Corner fosters an environment to meet each student's developmental and early learning needs. The learning centers in each classroom are equipped with appropriate materials to support the curriculum. The preschool's setting is designed to enhance each child's physical, social, emotional and cognitive development. CARE also has developmentalists on staff to help address specific developmental delays.

The preschool is licensed by the Pennsylvania Department of Education and follows a curriculum that is aligned with Pennsylvania Early Learning Standards. Tuition assistance and scholarships are available for qualified families.

Toddler Playgroup

The Toddler Playgroup focuses on the unique developmental needs of children ages 24-42 months. Focusing on language, the playgroup helps children enhance and acquire skills by providing a language-rich environment.

Social and sensory skills are promoted through structured play while focusing on manners and self-help skills. Playgroup focuses on activities that encompass one or more of the five senses and how toddlers can better explore the environment around them.

386 Children were screened by CARE therapists and teachers in 2020-2021.

Developmental Screenings

Therapy and early learning staff provide developmental screenings in various community settings. Developmental screenings look for and monitor signs that a young child may be delayed in one or more areas of development.

Physical therapists conduct scoliosis screenings at middle school. School-based therapists screen students who are identified by school staff to determine if adaptations are needed or if a formal evaluation is needed for services; and also attend Kindergarten Registration to screen incoming students.

Therapists may attend community events which screen children age birth to five for developmental delays. Delays or deficits screened for may include gross or fine motor skills, language/communication, social-emotional, and cognitive functioning.

Community Outreach

Community outreach efforts are important initiatives in CARE's overall delivery of services and programs. CARE recognizes the unique challenges raising a child with special health care needs poses and aims to provide positive supports.

Many of CARE's programs focus on family engagement and family support to ensure better outcomes for the children who participate.

Families join in decision-making and goal setting for their child; and staff engage families in two-way communication and advocacy and provide coaching and learning activities for the home and in the community.

Efforts include social work and family support services, transition and inclusion resources, family coaching in the Early Intervention Program; providing information, referrals and connections to community resources; programs to help parents enhance their young child's development; participation in community events; and the sponsorship of parent education, family support and professional workshops on a variety of topics.

CARE's Disability Awareness program aims to promote acceptance for children with physical and developmental disabilities. CARE conducts presentations upon request for schools in McKean and Potter Counties, as well as presentations for civic and professional groups.

CARE loans walkers, wheelchairs, lifts, bath chairs, adaptive recreation equipment, and other items with the referral of a health care provider. Equipment is subject to fit and availability.

CARE provides consultative services in collaboration with mobility professionals to provide a team approach for filling prescriptions for medical and adaptive equipment; and making necessary adjustments and repairs.

Therapeutic Recreation

Therapeutic recreation, for children with delays and disabilities, provides many benefits including; cardiovascular fitness and improved strength, balance, coordination and muscle control. Programs may also focus on fine motor activities, like arts and crafts. Studies show recreation for children improves self-esteem, provides an opportunity to gain socialization skills and promotes skills and movement.

In 2020-2021, CARE shifted gears to provide a series of online programs via Zoom. Monthly programs focused on one or more fun activities, with all supplies provided, that could be completed at home. At-home programming also increased family engagement, as family members joined in to help with the projects.

In addition to traditional recreation programs, CARE therapists assist the physical education teachers from the Bradford Area School District in conducting weekly adaptive gym classes for children who might need additional help. The goal of these classes is to promote life-long fitness and the positive self-esteem of students.





Child Safety & Injury Prevention Fiscal Year 2020-2021



CARE for Children is the lead agency for the McKean County Partnership with Safe Kids Pennsylvania. Safe Kids McKean is guided by an advisory committee comprised of representatives from local and state organizations, and volunteers; and child safety and injury prevention programs and initiatives are supported by United Way funding, donations, sponsorships, grants and CARE for Children Trust Income.

MCKEAN COUNTY CRIBS FOR KIDS

McKean County Cribs for Kids partners with Cribs for Kids®, a National Infant Safe-Sleep Initiative, to promote local infant safe sleep education and items. The program provides families a Cribette portable crib or Pack 'n Play® if they cannot otherwise afford safe-sleeping environments for their infants. CARE has two Safe Sleep Trainers on staff who provide parent education and training on proper sleep position and sleep environment for the baby.

CHILD PASSENGER SAFETY (CPS)

Safe Kids works closely with volunteer, certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians, the Pennsylvania Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics Traffic Injury Prevention Project (TIPP) and other organizations to properly fit car seats and provide replacement seats if needed. Funding from the United Way of the Bradford Area, Inc. ensures families in need have access to car seats. The program requires that a certified car seat technician fit and properly install the seat in the vehicle, and the car seat needs to be the primary seat for the child.

HOME SAFETY & PARENT RESOURCES

Since 2012, the McKean County partnership has worked with athome visitors to bring necessary home safety items/childproofing items to families in need. Safe Kids distributes various items such as universal gun locks, door knob covers, cupboard locks and latches, outlet covers, appliance locks, toilet seat locks, furniture straps, smoke detectors, and carbon monoxide detectors. The McKean County Family Centers, Parents as Teachers program, and Early Intervention providers are active partners for this program, providing family referrals. Families are also able to request items.

MCKEAN COUNTY KINDERGARTEN BICYCLE SAFETY

Safe Kids Pennsylvania - McKean County Partner has an ongoing effort which supports bicycle safety and helmet use initiatives for Kindergarten students across McKean County. CARE staff, along with the support of community funders, participates in bicycle safety education, helmet give-aways and fittings for local Kindergarten classes and fits helmets for other age groups by request.

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

Throughout the year, representatives from the Safe Kids Partnership, CARE staff and child safety partners participate in various community-wide initiatives and events to promote child safety and injury prevention efforts. The partnership also provides training on various child safety-related topics to organizations and community groups.

PENNSYLVANIA

Program Spotlight- Gun Safety & Children Fiscal Year 2020-2021

McKean County, PA-- An accidental child shooting, that occurred in March of 2020 in McKean County, prompted several local organizations, led by the Safe Kids Pennsylvania - McKean County Partnership, to collaborate to provide cable-style gunlocking devices to families. Funding for the locks was provided by the United Way of the Bradford Area, Inc.

"Receiving a call that a child has been shot is the worst call I have ever received," said Stephanie Vettenburg-Shaffer, McKean County District Attorney. "Unfortunately, I've received that call more than once. In a neighboring county, a child lost his life recently due to an accidental shooting."

Vettenburg-Shaffer added, "I cannot imagine the pain a family suffers when a child's life is lost. Thank you to area agencies for making locking devices available. You will never know the number of young lives saved."

In the spring of 2021, the Safe Kids Pennsylvania McKean County Partnership distributed universal gun locks to local law enforcement agencies, including the Bradford City Police Department, Foster Township Police Department, Bradford Township Police Department, Otto-Eldred Regional Police Department, Port Allegany Borough Police Department, Kane Police Department and Smethport Police Department.

In addition to the locks, the partnership is providing handouts with helpful gun safety tips for parents and age-appropriate gun safety activity booklets geared for school-age children.

CARE for Children also has a supply of the gun locks to distribute through the organization's Home Safety Program which gives out childproofing items, smoke detectors and other safety items to local families in need.

"Since 2006, the Safe Kids McKean Partnership and CARE for Children have worked to establish programs and promote initiatives that prevent accidental childhood injuries, disabilities or fatalities," said Tina M. Martin, CARE executive director and Safe Kids coordinator. "We are pleased to collaborate with our partners to get these live-saving devices into the hands of families who need them."

The gun locks were purchased from a vendor that works with Project ChildSafe, a program that promotes firearms safety and education through Law Enforcement Organizations.

The McKean County Safe Kids Program, along with its partners, is committed to promoting firearms safety, raising awareness about the safe and responsible ownership of firearms, and the importance of storing firearms securely when not in use to keep children safe and help prevent accidents, theft, and misuse.




